

Kindergarten

The Kindergarten program offers a balanced approach to active learning which fosters social, emotional, motor, intellectual, and spiritual development. The Kindergarten curriculum integrates Reading, Language Arts, Social Studies, Math, and Science into thematic units of study. Our structured full-day program introduces students to formal Reading and Math instruction in a developmentally appropriate setting, based on our understanding and awareness of children's social, emotional, and cognitive needs.

Language and Literacy

The language program is designed to meet the various levels of emerging reading, writing, and spelling abilities of the five and six year old child. The balanced curriculum program includes phonics, journaling, interactive writing, word wall, phonemic awareness, and De'Nealian handwriting. A wide assortment of quality children's literature promotes interest in reading and writing. Supplemental programs include Lexia Early/Primary Reading, Lindamood Bell Phonemic Awareness Program, Visual Phonics, and Sign Language.

Mathematics

Math in Focus, a form of Singapore Math, has been newly adopted in the Kindergarten program. Our Math program focuses on numeration skills as well as number recognition, skip counting, and sequencing. Students learn to create and recognize patterns and explore the concept of time and money. Children work with length, weight, graphs, and tally marks. The students begin to learn addition and subtraction facts through the use of manipulatives and oral story problems.

Science and Social Studies

In Kindergarten, science and social studies are included within the literature component of the Language Arts program.

Technology

The Kindergarten students have opportunities to use age-appropriate software and iPads in the classroom.

The Kindergarten students are afforded the opportunity to attend daily Music and Motor Development sessions.
