Christian Education

As an Episcopal School, our aim is to manifest the daily experience of the love of God in our lives. Therefore, Christian Education at the School is not about dogma. In an age-appropriate way, it is a time for students, and faculty, both to seek clarity about their own beliefs and religions, and to look for ways to honor those traditions more fully and faithfully in their own lives.

Early Childhood 3 through the Fifth Grade attend a weekly session of Godly Play. Godly Play lets children explore their faith through story, to gain religious language and to enhance their spiritual experience though wonder and play. Godly Play is based on Montessori principles and developed using a spiral curriculum.

The Middle School meets with Father Steve once a week. During this time together, students have the opportunity to investigate a variety of topics such the points of transition within the Christian faith including baptism, marriage, and death; explore the major world religions; and study Biblical themes and discuss how they relate to their own lives in the 21st century.
