



Job Title: Teacher of Spanish (Up to 14 hours per week)

In previous years, Spanish has been taught to Second through Eighth Grade. With the right candidate, the School would like to change this format, and introduce Spanish to our youngest students (Early Childhood 3). The compulsory study of Spanish would continue through the Fifth Grade, with it becoming an elective for Middle School. Classes have been scheduled for after lunch each day, but there is some flexibility in this continuing in the same way.

Responsibilities as Spanish Teacher Include:

- Develop comprehensive and sequential Spanish curriculum for Early Childhood 3 – Eighth Grades;
- Prepare and teach lessons to Early Childhood 3 through the Fifth Grade; and,
- Prepare and teach elective classes in Sixth – Eighth Grades.

Additional Responsibilities Include:

- Ensure appropriate and available technology is integrated into the Spanish curriculum;
- Assist in providing information for any Spanish specific grant applications;
- Attend faculty meetings as scheduled;
- Attend mandatory School functions;
- Attend professional development workshops and trainings; and,
- Other duties as assigned by the Headmaster.

Requirements:

- Bachelor's or Master's degree;
- Relevant Oklahoma State certification, or ability to achieve certification;
- Ability to work with a wide range of ages and abilities; and,
- Sense of humor.

The successful candidate will be required to pass a background check and complete the Safeguarding God's Children program.
